GRANT HIGHLIGHTS

Generous grant funding for fiscal year 2024 supports St. Rose Community Health, which annually provides culturally aware programs, health navigation, and transportation to 200,000-plus people in need, especially those who are vulnerable and low income. We are grateful to our funders for making these programs possible.

Awarded \$105,000 to support our Helping Hands of Henderson Program, which provides more than 12,500 rides annually to seniors to medical appointments, food pantries, congregate meals, and other important errands.

Celebrating St. Rose Volunteer: John Baggs

John Baggs has been volunteering since he was in high school. He began with church and environmental conservation in northwest Indiana and later volunteered in the historic preservation of a small church constructed in 1832, in an elementary school classroom, and for Habitat for Humanity in St. Louis and Las Vegas. This involvement led to an interest in volunteering at St. Rose in 2013, when his wife had knee replacement surgery at the Siena Campus. Seeing volunteers helping patients, visitors and medical staff spiked his interest.

Q: Which hospital area(s) do you volunteer in, and why do you prefer those areas?

JB: My first day of volunteering at St. Rose was at the front desk at the hospital entrance. Those first few weeks introduced me to a very dedicated and caring crew of volunteers. However, my rather active career of working at a much faster pace did not match well with the front desk. I requested a move to a service area at a faster pace. The answer was the Emergency Room, and I have loved every minute since. I enjoy meeting the walk-in traffic and trying my best to make the patients and visitors as welcome and comfortable as possible. I find enjoyment in providing non-medical assistance to the medical staff. Anytime I can save a step or two of a medical staff personnel such as getting a warm blanket or escort someone to medical records, I believe I have freed a staff person actually trained in the medical field to apply that training. For sure, a volunteer does not need medical training or a degree to respond to a wheelchair request or pick up a disk at radiology.

Q: How often do you volunteer?

JB: I volunteer every Monday and Thursday afternoon and special occasions such as staff training, the open house for the Dominican Tower grand opening, or preparing gift items for Nurse Appreciation Week.

Q: What does a typical volunteer session look like for you?

JB: No two afternoons are exactly the same because patient needs and visitor requests so often vary as well as the staff.

Q: What's the best thing about volunteering at St. Rose?

JB: The best thing about volunteering at St. Rose is the meeting of people, the assistance to medical staff, and the satisfaction of helping patients and visitors.

Q: What's the most unusual question or request you've been asked as a volunteer?

JB: Once a rather inebriated individual walked (staggering) into the ED asking, "Where can I find a margarita?"

Q: What have you learned from volunteering for St. Rose?

JB: I now better realize the dedication of hospital staff to serving

the patients. Even after a trying day from sometimes very critical work, with days of late breaks for personal time, they continue to serve as if they had just started their daily shift. These medical personnel are my heroes. They are people helping people.

Q: Is there anyone at St. Rose who has been especially important to you as a volunteer, and if so, who and why?

JB: There are many at St. Rose who are or have been important to me. Some have moved to other locations and I would not try to name all of them nor would I want to name a single one on the list.

Q: What would you like people to know about volunteers at St. Rose?

JB: I would like people to know that volunteers are at St. Rose because they want to be there. The volunteers want to provide a service that the volunteer would like to receive themselves when visiting the hospital. The volunteers often go home after a time at the hospital tired and in need of rest because they want to serve and hopefully make others more comfortable.

Q: What helpful advice can you offer someone who might serve as a St. Rose volunteer?

JB: Helpful advice must be offered truthfully to any question received. Even if not knowing the best and correct answer, just say so. However, follow up with, let me find the answer to your question. Inform the individual you will find someone to really answer the question properly. Answering the question properly is important to the individual asking or they would not ask even when it seems rather minor to the volunteer. The volunteer might just be in the same shoes someday and facing a similar dilemma someday. Treat others as you want to be treated.

The Children's Emergency Room at the Siena Campus in Henderson, Nevada, is the only hospital ER in the southeast part of the valley that caters specifically to children.

Fifth Neighborhood Hospital Campus will expand access to healthcare for Centennial Hills community

Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican Hospitals broke ground on a new Neighborhood Hospital, a vital healthcare facility poised to enhance medical accessibility for the local community. Set in the heart of the vibrant Centennial Hills community, the state-of-the-art facility at 725 W Centennial Parkway marks St. Rose Dominican's fifth small-format hospital of its kind in Las Vegas.

"This is indeed a momentous occasion for the Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican family and for the Centennial Hills community," said Jon Van Boening, President of Dignity Health Nevada.

"When opened, the Dignity Health Neighborhood Hospital Centennial Hills Campus will be our fifth such facility across our vast community, as we extend our mission and our commitment to provide compassionate care to our southern Nevada neighbors. We are confident the current and future residents of this growing area will come to count on us to provide exceptional professional healthcare, in the same way families across the valley have come to St. Rose for more than 75 years."

With a profound focus on improving access to healthcare services, these neighborhood hospitals, which are built and operated through a partnership with Emerus Holdings Inc., address the essential needs of patients and families across the Las Vegas valley, beyond the reach of Dignity Health's three acute care hospitals.

"Emerus is proud to be part of this groundbreaking project, which will further enhance access to healthcare services for the people of northwest Las Vegas," said Vic Schmerbeck, CEO of Emerus Holdings Inc. "Our partnership with Dignity Health –



St. Rose Dominican allows us to deliver top-notch medical care through our small-format hospitals, bringing compassionate and experienced care teams closer to where patients live and work."

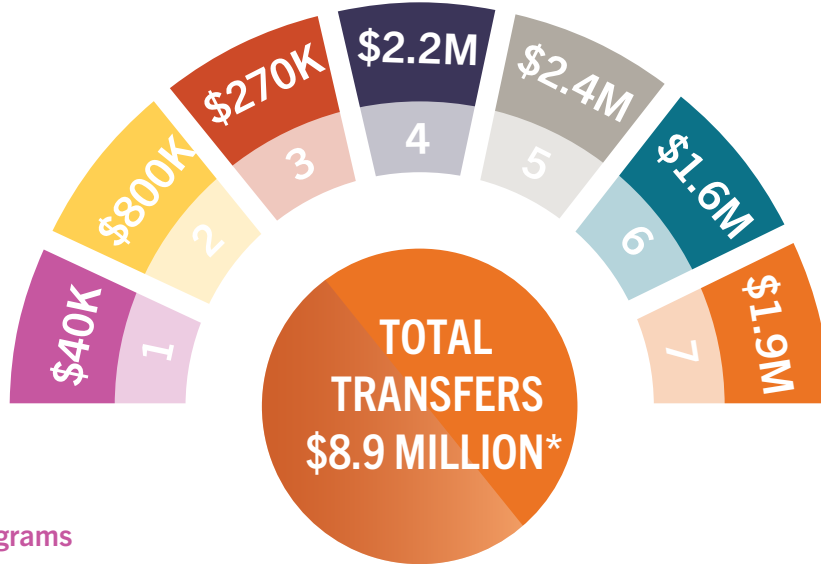
Like the four existing Dignity Health Neighborhood Hospital campuses, the design and layout of the new Centennial Campus has been thoughtfully crafted to cater to the specific requirements of the community. The facility spans approximately 24,000-square-feet across two floors and will house 10 well-equipped inpatient beds and eight emergency exam rooms, including a dedicated triage room. The facility will be staffed by board-certified physicians, experienced nurses, and other clinical specialists, ensuring the same level of compassionate, patient-focused care found at existing Dignity Health neighborhood hospital locations. This commitment to excellence ensures that patients receive swift and compassionate care during their time of need.

Beyond elevating the standard of healthcare available, the Centennial Campus is set to have a substantial positive economic impact on the local community. It will create job opportunities and foster a robust healthcare ecosystem, driving positive change and contributing to a healthier future for the residents of northwest Las Vegas.

Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican remains steadfast in its mission to serve the community with the highest quality healthcare services. The groundbreaking of the new Neighborhood Hospital marks another milestone in this commitment, paving the way for enhanced medical accessibility and care.

1 Employee Programs

Funds are used to support employee appreciation events, wellness programs for employees, the annual Halloween Trunk or Treat at San Martin, and Winter Wonderland event at Rose de Lima.

2 Capital Projects

Various items were purchased to augment and enhance all three hospitals.

3 Rose De Lima Simulation Center

Hosts three state-of-the-art simulation rooms allowing learners to practice and develop clinical expertise using adult, pediatric, infant, and neonatal patient simulators.

4 Graduate Medical Education

Phase one of the residency program launched in July of 2023 and is focused on internal and family medicine. We intend to grow these programs to offer additional resident programs in future phases pending philanthropic support.

5 Pediatric Services Operations and Capital

CMN funds purchased much-needed capital equipment for neonatal and pediatric services lines, such as portable transport monitors, Panda Warmers, Giraffe Isolettes, and Jaundice Billimeters.

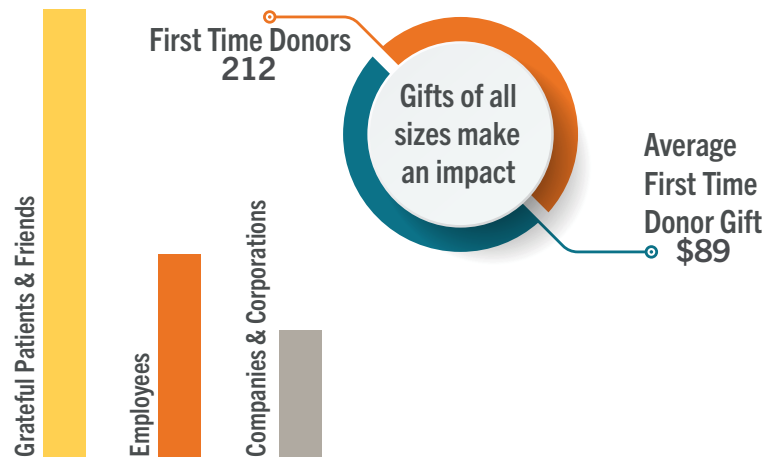
6 Pediatric Charity Care

Include but are not limited to the Engelstad Foundation R.E.D. Rose Program, Helping Hands of Henderson, WomensCare, and Wellness Centers.

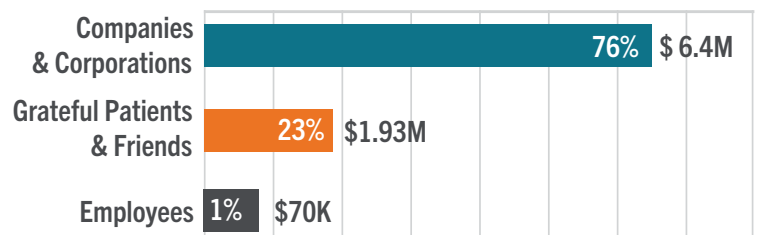

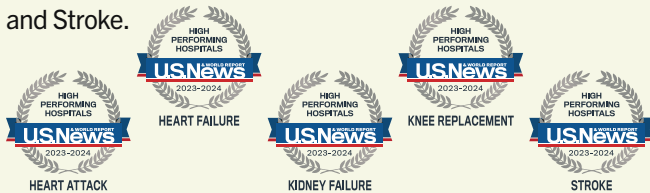

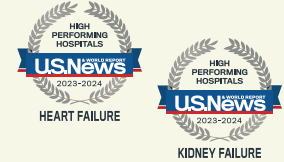
Two St. Rose Dominican Hospitals Earn ‘High Performing’ Ratings in U.S. News & World Report Best Hospitals 2023-2024 Survey

Two Dignity Health-St. Rose Dominican Hospitals in southern Nevada have been named by U.S. News & World Report to its 2023-2024 Best Hospitals survey as High Performing hospitals. This is the highest distinction a hospital can earn for U.S. News’ Best Hospitals Procedures & Conditions ratings.

Siena Hospital in Henderson earned the High Performing distinctions in five categories. Those categories are Heart Attack, Heart Failure, Kidney Failure, Knee Replacement, and Stroke.



San Martín Hospital in southwest Las Vegas earned High Performing distinctions in two categories - Heart Failure and Kidney Failure.



The annual Procedures & Conditions ratings are designed to assist patients and their doctors in making informed decisions about where to receive care for challenging health conditions or elective procedures.

U.S. News evaluated more than 4,500 hospitals across 15 specialties and 21 procedures and conditions. Hospitals awarded a “Best” designation excelled at factors such as clinical outcomes, level of nursing care and patient experience.

SAN MARTÍN DELIVERS A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR MOTHERS

At the San Martín Campus we're taking steps to advance how we welcome new lives into the world, creating a place where moms can safely and confidently have a more natural and holistic birth. Our staff of highly trained nurses and physicians embrace the opportunity to work with patients on their individualized birth plan, creating an experience where moms feels empowered to deliver the way that is most comfortable for her.

Care for low to moderate-risk pregnancies

San Martín Hospital is a designated Level I facility by the Maternal Levels of Care Verification program through The Joint Commission, which means the hospital specializes in low to moderate-risk pregnancies for babies with a gestational period of 35 weeks or more.

Private Mother/Baby Suites

Highly trained and caring staff will work with each mother on her timeline and be there every step of the way through the birth experience. All of the exceptional care happens in one spacious, private suite.

At San Martín, the patient doesn't switch rooms – she is in the same suite for the entire experience. In fact, San Martín

is the only hospital in the Las Vegas Valley that operates on the LDRP model, which means you labor, deliver, recover, and complete postpartum care in the same suite. Here, patients do more bonding and less moving.

Our birthing suites are large, designated to give mothers plenty of room to move around during labor, with full adjustable birthing beds, private bathrooms with showers, and pull-out beds for significant others to spend the night. We also support rooming-in, allowing mother and baby to get to know each other during this special time.



DAVID BERMAN – WHY I SUPPORT ST. ROSE

Rosalyn and I are right up the road in Sun City Anthem. It seemed like a natural thing to support the only nonprofit faith-based hospital in southern Nevada.

We wanted to plan for the proper and appropriate use of our assets after we were gone. We felt that the best way we could do that is to select organizations that are doing good in the community. St. Rose immediately became one of the major organizations we wanted to include in our estate plan.

We don't specify what should be done with any money we donate. We want St. Rose to decide what to do with the funds. We know they have been on the cutting edge and using technology to take care of patients.

We just felt that the impact we could make in our own small way was that they would put the money to good use and benefit those in the greatest need.

THE HENDERSON SENIOR FOOD PANTRY

The Henderson Senior Food Pantry provides a monthly delivery of groceries to homebound residents age 60 and older so that they can remain independent and healthy. We help seniors who are vulnerable, low income, and struggle with food insecurity. Partnering with Three Square's Golden Groceries program, St. Rose provides 20 pounds of nonperishable items, 10 pounds of fresh produce, and a loaf of bread every month. Volunteers and staff deliver the food to each client. In fiscal year 2023, we made 2,177 food deliveries to 320 clients.

This service grows out of our Helping Hands of Henderson Program, which St. Rose created in 1995 to provide free transportation and support services to seniors living at home who are at risk of institutional placement. Pantries in Henderson restrict the frequency of visits, and many seniors lack the stamina to wait in long lines. In 2018, as we

became more aware of the nutritional needs of our seniors, we established the food pantry and grocery delivery program at our Rose de Lima Hospital. Since then, we have continued to expand the Henderson Senior Food Pantry to respond to the growing demand in our community.

State grant funding enabled us to equip the pantry and launch a pilot program, but to sustain and grow this initiative we need additional funding. If you are interested in supporting the Henderson Senior Food Pantry, please contact the St. Rose Dominican Health Foundation at 702.616.4545.





Transforming Healthcare in Southern Nevada by Training the Next Generation of Expert Physicians

At Dignity Health - St. Rose Dominican, we are committed to providing the highest-quality healthcare services in our community.

A proven way to meet our growing healthcare needs and expand the local physician workforce is to increase support for training by offering more medical and fellowship programs, known as Graduate Medical Education (GME).

As a long-term benefit of GME, St. Rose will keep patients out of the hospital and prevent readmissions. Residents will work at newly established patient care clinics as part of their training. As a result, we will provide expanded care for patients, especially those who are vulnerable, underserved, and marginalized; greater specialty referrals within our organization; and increased continuity of care.

“Through GME, we will build a culture of teaching, learning, and

continuous innovation at St. Rose hospitals. We have designed our residency programs to produce physicians who can provide high-value care to improve clinical outcomes,” said Rodney Buzzas, MD, Designated Institutional Official for Graduate Medical Education Programs at St. Rose Hospitals.

Over the last few years, generous private gifts and state grant funding have enabled St. Rose to begin establishing residency programs in Family Medicine and Internal Medicine. The Health Foundation needs additional philanthropic support to expand the GME Program, creating a unique legacy by building the future of healthcare in the Las Vegas valley. Partnering together, we can transform the healthcare landscape in our community for generations to come.

White Coat Ceremony Marks Turning Point for New Doctors

First-ever St. Rose medical residents embark on three-year commitment in southern Nevada

The first 12 medical residents in the history of St. Rose Dominican Hospitals recently received their white coats in a brief ceremony at San Martín Hospital. For the dozen recent medical school graduates who comprise the inaugural class of St. Rose residents, the event marks the beginning of three years of clinical training as Internal Medicine residents in southern Nevada. For Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican, this is the realization of a long sought-after mission to establish a Graduate Medical Education Program that will improve health care in our community.

What it means: The White Coat Ceremony is a major turning point in the career of every medical doctor. In the medical field, the white coat is a symbol of authority and professionalism. The length of the white coat corresponds with the level of training a physician has received. Medical students wear short white coats. Residents wear a mid-length white coat. This event marks the first time these new doctors will receive their coats as they begin the next phase of their medical careers.

“The key objective of developing Graduate Medical Education programs at St Rose is to educate and retain high quality physicians and prepare them to address the healthcare needs of our community, especially those who are vulnerable, underserved, and marginalized. In creating opportunities for young doctors and providing exceptional training in a community-based setting, we hope they will remain here and become valued members of our community,” said Rodney Buzzas, MD.

12 of 1,200: Members of the inaugural Internal Medicine Residency class were selected from more than 1,200 applicants. Two members of the inaugural class are from the Las Vegas area, with two others graduating from Las Vegas-based Touro University Nevada College of Osteopathic Medicine. The remainder of the group brings a beneficial diversity of hometowns, colleges, and cultures from across the nation and around the world.

Recruiting efforts for this class focused on candidates with interests in volunteerism and community service, life experience outside of medicine, patient advocacy, serving diverse, under-represented and vulnerable populations, addressing healthcare inequities, and living and working in southern Nevada.

Each year, 12 new residents will join the three-year St. Rose Internal Medicine program, growing it to a total of 36 residents in its third year. One third of these residents will follow a specialized track for doctors planning to practice as Primary Care physicians.

Kimberly Bates, MD, Program Director for the Internal Medicine Residency Program, said, “The driving force for the development of Graduate Medical Education programs at St. Rose is the physician shortage in Nevada, especially in primary care. As these first residents take the next significant step in their careers, they are but the first of many medical professionals we hope to bring to southern Nevada to train and ultimately live and work in our community.”

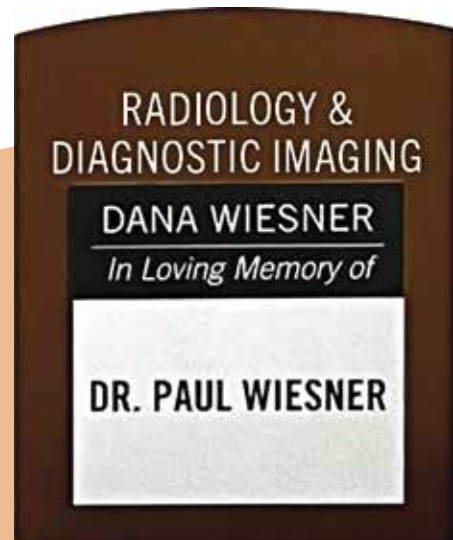


DR. PAUL WIESNER PLAQUE UNVEILING
