EMPOWERED PROACTIVELY ADDRESSING OPIOID USE AMONG PREGNANT WOMEN

As the opioid epidemic grips our nation, St. Rose volunteers tenderly cradle its youngest sufferers – the babies born dependent on the substances their mothers used during pregnancy. This cuddly form of humankindness is just one feature of St. Rose's grant-funded **EMPOWERED** (*Empower Mothers for Positive Outcomes with Education, Recovery and Early Development*) program.

Babies born to opioid addicted mothers may experience neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) characterized by withdrawal symptoms such as tremors, seizures, problems sleeping, irritability, and weight loss. The Baby Cuddler program provides NAS babies the comfort and security they need to recover and thrive.

According to Holly Lyman, Director of Community Outreach, St. Rose's doctors, pharmacists and community health educators designed EMPOWERED to positively impact the lives of opioid addicted pregnant women and their babies. "Our aim is to help pregnant mothers and their babies achieve healthy, addiction-free futures," says Holly. By collaborating with the St. Rose Dominican Health Foundation, the EMPOWERED program team secured a \$356,000 Nevada State Targeted Response Grant to launch the program.

EMPOWERED offers pregnant women who test positive for opioid or other substance usage – and who accept help – access to mental health services and St. Rose's Outreach Centers array of offerings: group peer support, WIC, lactation support, parenting classes, and NAS education. After birth, babies born at St. Rose are provided neonatal intensive care including cuddling. Once they leave the hospital, they are monitored by a physician and receive physical, occupational and speech therapy assessments at their first, third and sixth months.

A 2016 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention study of 28 states found on average, six in 1,000 babies were born with NAS in 2013, up from 1.5 in 1,000 in 1999. Nevada's rate at the time was 4.8 in 1,000 babies born addicted.

ST. ROSE LEADS STATE'S POSTPARTUM SUPPORT SERVICES

Last year, St. Rose, manager of the grant-funded Nevada Statewide Maternal Child and Health Coalition, provided postpartum mood and anxiety disorder (PMAD) recognition and response training to more than 500 health professionals statewide to ensure those affected are identified for treatment and support services.

Welcoming a baby is a blessed occasion that is expected to be blissful. Quick cases of the "baby blues" are often anticipated, but PMAD symptoms such as depression, anxiety, obsessive compulsive disorder, and post-traumatic stress can occur up to two years after giving birth. In fact, PMAD, including postpartum depression, is the leading complication of childbirth, affecting 1 in 7 women with higher rates experienced among women of low socioeconomic status. What's more, fathers are also susceptible to PMAD.

To ensure those affected are identified for treatment and support, St. Rose surrounds expectant and new parents with support through PMAD awareness discussions during childbirth classes, hospital tours, and community outreach presentations. After baby is born, PMAD parents have access to one-on-one therapeutic counseling services and telephone support, co-facilitated Mommy Mixers and PMAD support groups at St. Rose's three Community Wellness Centers. Support groups are shown to alleviate the

PMAD parent's feelings of guilt, shame, and isolation; reduce the stigma and risk factors of the disorder; and, encourage healthy bonding with baby.

FROM DARKNESS TO LIGHT: ONE MOM'S GLOWING REPORT

Hopeless and helpless. When you suffer from perinatal mood and anxiety disorder (PMAD), you feel both. You want a baby but do not expect this additional dark stranger. It makes each day a struggle to take care of your family.

I'd beaten PMAD before, but after my second baby, it engulfed me. I tried medications, weekly therapy and finally called Postpartum Support International at my breaking point. They gave me Jacqueline Kennedy's name at St. Rose Dominican hospitals. Her voice was soothing and compassionate, and she told me about a new support group. That gave me hope!

I left my first support group gathering feeling like I was no longer alone in this darkness. Others felt what I was feeling. They helped me find the light. A year later, I attended St. Rose's Afterglow PMAD training to help the facilitator, Alicia Mattera, strengthen the support group. I was moved to see the room filled with people concerned about the crisis of losing mothers, children, and families to PMAD. Help, support, and education can end the stigma of this real, dark battle.

With St. Rose's support, my PMAD journey has taught me a great deal about myself and others. I now have an amazing Mama Tribe and a passion to help others through the darkness.

THE FIORE'S HEALTH CARE LEGACY

Why They Made an IRA Charitable Rollover Gift to St. Rose

Compassionate care is embedded in the Fiore family's vocational DNA. It crosses centuries, continents, our nation, and generations. That's one reason Sylvia and Nick Fiore Sr. chose to support St. Rose's not-for-profit, faith-based legacy with a tax-free gift made directly from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) to the St. Rose Dominican Health Foundation.

"The health care lineage flows from Sylvia's great grandmother, but when Italy's Amalfi Coast was invaded in 1943, her family fled. All records of her great grandmother's family were lost," says Nick, Sr. "Thus, what we do know, we celebrate." One of Sylvia's relatives - a first generation American - became a doctor and founded a private hospital in Pittsburgh in the 1920s. The hospital tended to Italian and African-American residents who had limited access to the area's larger hospitals. Sylvia's Aunt Rose delivered modern nursing care to coalminers in remote Pennsylvania towns, and three of her cousins became registered nurses. One provides diabetes education to New Mexico's Navajo population. Sylvia, now retired, is also a registered nurse and the Fiore health care tradition is being carried on by her son, Nick Jr., a local pediatric surgeon and his wife, Stephanie Davidson, a pediatric anesthesiologist. A few of the Fiore's grandchildren are eyeing health care careers.

"Our intent is three-fold. The gift from our IRA will benefit St. Rose's pediatric services, pay tribute to our family's vocational legacy, and demonstrate our gratitude for the outstanding care Sylvia has received at St. Rose," says Nick Sr.

In 2013, a traumatic car accident crushed several of Sylvia's vertebrae. Doctors initially questioned whether she would walk again but St. Rose's neurosurgeon, James Forage, MD, rebuilt her spine and with intensive therapy, she regained excellent mobility. Sylvia, now 80, also had a recent knee replacement at St. Rose. While recovery has not been a walk in the park, she is making great strides on her new knee.

PROGRAMS FUNDED BY CHILDREN'S MIRACLE NETWORK DONATIONS

QUALITY EDUCATION ENHANCES CARE

Being born prematurely and critically ill is traumatic. Fragile newborns are helpless, and frightened parents often feel powerless in the complex neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). St. Rose prioritizes minimizing stress experienced in the NICU and empowering parents as care providers. That's why the hospital's partner, Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, recently funded a Touch a Life, Impact a Lifetime Workshop for all members of the interdisciplinary team that interact with tiny patient and their parents. The workshop led by Mary Coughlin, an internationally recognized expert in trauma-informed NICU care, emphasizes how team members can meet stringent care standards while also creating a more peaceful, nurturing experience that will benefit the entire NICU family in the short-term and over a lifetime.

DRÄGER VENTILATION SYSTEM

Neonatal ventilation is highly complex and challenging. Caring for the smallest patients at St. Rose is one of the most demanding tasks imaginable. For these infants, new specialized neonatal ventilator technology is paving the way home. To prevent pulmonary injury, immature lungs, and underdeveloped breathing, regulation mechanisms require extremely gentle ventilation, advanced sensor and compensation technology. With community donations through Children's Miracle Network, St. Rose recently acquired 6 new Dräger Babylog VH 500 ventilation systems to better care for these precious patients.

CHARITY CARE

Millions of Americans are underinsured or go entirely without health insurance each year. Last year alone, Dignity Health - St. Rose Dominican provided over \$6 million dollars in pediatric charity care to Nevada's families. As southern Nevada's only faith based, not-for-profit health care system, St. Rose's charity care program is critical to getting the health care people need without regard to their ability to pay. This uncompensated health care, which is provided free or at a reduced cost, makes an invaluable difference in the lives of thousands of Nevadans every year. With donations from the community and our Corporate Partners, Children's Miracle Network was able to transfer \$1.8 million dollars of precious funds to the hospital last year for the use of pediatric charity care.

A gift of securities is easy to make, even electronically, and donors receive credit based on the fair market value of the securities donated.

3) Tax-Free IRA Gifts

If you are 70½ years or older, you can make a tax-free IRA gift in support of St. Rose. Simply contact your IRA plan administrator to request a direct qualified charitable distribution from the IRA account to Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican, a 501(c)(3) organization (Tax ID 94-1196203). It is important to note the IRA Charitable Rollover law is now permanent and allows you to give up to \$100,000 per year directly from your IRA to one or more qualified charities without paying federal income tax on the withdrawal.
