St. Rose Dominican's New "Neighborly" Hospital Breaks Ground



Dignity Health – St. Rose Dominican recently broke ground on its first of four neighborhood hospitals designed to increase access to high-quality emergency care, primary care, and outreach services in underserved areas of the greater Las Vegas valley.

At the groundbreaking ceremony, North Las Vegas Mayor John Lee called St. Rose Dominican a “welcome neighbor” and the smaller hospitals “the future of hospital care in the region.” Charlie Guida, President of the St. Rose Dominican Health Foundation, points out that these forward-thinking neighborhood hospitals slated to open by mid-2017 – the hospital’s 70th anniversary year – also reflect the spirit of the hospital’s roots.

“Our Adrian Dominican sisters came to southern Nevada with a vision of providing quality, whole-body healing to anyone in need,” says Charlie. “Significant to their success, however, was that they began small – our Rose de Lima Campus had only 14 patient beds at the time. The smaller setting allowed the sisters to foster strong, healthy relationships with the community. Our neighborhood hospitals offer a similar type of opportunity.”

The first level of each of the three-story hospitals will feature a comprehensive emergency department, six to ten inpatient rooms, diagnostic imaging, and quick-access lab services open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. “Our neighborhood hospitals will alleviate some of the congestion our valley’s bigger hospitals experience by providing quality, emergency services within neighborhoods that have lacked convenient access to vital care,” says Brian Brannman, Senior Vice President of Operations, Nevada.

The second and third floors of each hospital will feature Dignity Health Medical Group physician clinics, additional physician offices, St. Rose Dominican outreach programs, and other ancillary clinical services. “Our ministry aims to improve community wellbeing,” says Brian. “These new campuses will also offer programs that increase health IQ and equip residents with the skills to effectively manage health issues that range from diabetes and heart disease to pregnancy and childbirth.”

The North Las Vegas Campus, located at Craig Road and Camino Del Norte, will be followed by a Blue Diamond Campus, West Flamingo Campus, and Sahara Campus. Two additional valley locations are also under consideration. St. Rose Dominican is collaborating with Emerus on the neighborhood hospitals, which will cost \$25 to \$28 million and create approximately 100 new jobs per campus.
